

Certified Copies at Torii Station

Military notaries may only certify copies of original documents. With very few exceptions (see below), military notaries may not certify copies of publicly recorded documents (AR 27-55 para. 4-5). Customers desiring certified copies of documents will be referred as follows:

Court Documents. Personnel requiring certified copies of court documents must request the copies from the clerk of the court having possession of the document. Only the issuing court may provide certified copies of court documents such as decrees and orders.

Vital Statistic Records. Many vital statistics documents, such as birth and death certificate, may not, by law, be copied and certified. Personnel requiring certified copies of these documents must apply to the issuing state for original or certified documents.

Personnel desiring to “certify” their own copies (we will notarize your signature) should do the following:

Make copies of the documents and present the copies to a notary with the language below typed on the front or back of the copies:

I certify that this is a true and exact copy of (name of document).

Subscribed and Sworn to before me by (Your typed name) _____

on (date) _____ *at Torii Station, Okinawa, Japan.*

Exceptions: For Social Security Card Applications and military administrative purposes, we can make certified copies of needed documents.
